Top 10 Photography Tips For Stagers

- 1. Use a tripod.
- 2. Set the camera up a little lower than eye level, and make sure it is level to avoid distortion.
- 3. Use an ISO of 200, an aperature of f/8-11, set your flash to TTL -1, and use a wide angle lens.
- 4. Use bounce flash on a neutral surface to help balance the outside light with the inside.
- 5. Look through your lens to make final styling adjustments. Make sure each item is spaced properly and overlaps correctly.
- 6. Don't cut walkways off too much. Allow the viewer to see how to get around the room.
- 7. Declutter. Rearrange items until your eye comfortably flows around the image.
- 8. Add an element of life through flowers, vegetables, fruits, pets or people.
- 9. Create a story about lifestyle through your props. Your viewer should be able to imagine themselves in the space and desire to be there.
- 10. Use varying heights, sizes and textures when putting together a table setting. Also, consider using a less traditional setting. Tables do not need to covered, but it is a great place to add color and interest to a large, monotone surface.
